Temporary Signs

Municipal Code 15.08.040(G)

What is a Temporary Sign? A temporary sign is a lightweight, non-permanent sign intended to display advertising over short periods of time.

What are the rules?

- Approval of an annual sign permit application and receipt of a permit are required for temporary signs.
- Temporary signs may be displayed for up to 30 days per calendar year.
- Not more than 5 temporary signs may be displayed. The cumulative total area of all signs may not exceed 81 square feet.
- Illumination is not permitted.
- Temporary signs must be placed on your building or property and may not be placed in the right-of-way. It is the responsibility of business owners to know where property lines start and stop.
- Temporary signs may not block driveways, sidewalks or parking spaces.

Provided the City standards are met, the following are examples of temporary signs that may be permitted:

Determining Allowable Size: Up to five temporary signs may be permitted, but the total area of the signs may not exceed **81 square feet (sf)**.



Four feather/fin signs each measuring 8-feet tall by 2-feet wide, 16 sf each.
TOTAL: 16 sf X 4 = 64 sf, meeting the City standard.



Eight feather/fin signs each measuring 8-feet tall by 2-feet wide, 16 sf each.
TOTAL: 16 sf X 8 = 128 sf, not meeting the City standard.
